Brief notes and descriptions for things I attended at ELUNA.

Using the SFX API:

Texas A&M is using this from their Endeavor catalog to have the OpenURL display conditionally. They use javascript , the SFX API, PERL, and some MARC fields to determine when an SFX link should display in their catalog. Pretty slick.

CDL is using this in a more traditional way, although they are looking behind the scenes to see if fulltext is available before displaying their button in some cases.

uberating our openurls:

Ross Singer from Georgia Tech demo-ed how they are using the SFX API mashed with services like Google API, Amazon API, etc. The system runs a bit slowly right now but that is largely because of their catalog. Basically, in this instance the SFX API becomes one of many data sources to drive users to content.

X-Service Interest Group:

This group just discussed business items like coordinating X-Services across all ExLibris products. There was a brief discussion of security issues related to X-Services. We will likely want to limit access to X-Services to particular, secure machines, i.e. like Alexandria, etc.

Metalib Update:

Mainly they just talked about the new structure for Metalib. They will be creating an upgrade express which seems useful. Some items of interest are that they are working on keyword vs. phrase searching as the default. They are also working on clustering which will be a big deal/value for us and our users. Clustering will be done using vivissimo.

SFX MARCIt!:

Nettie talked a bit about some potential enhancements to MARCIt, namely things that our modification program does, conditional manipulation, etc. This is probably a ways off yet, but coming soon will be the ability to choose what types of records you would like, namely print or electronic when both are available. This helps with institutions who use different approaches to cataloging, i.e. single vs. multiple record approach.

Rethinking Metasearch for a Better User Experience

Rochester is doing some really interesting things with SFX that we will likely want to look at when we go into the FindText overhaul this next year. Namely they have created some techniques for getting users to full text in better ways. Their usability results are informed by an ethnographer who studies research behavior. This data could inform our own choices on metasearch.
