 - b. Consistency
 - c. Match the other library holdings
 - d. Create brief public displays
 - e. Import HOL data into SFX
 - f. Use for old titles and current titles
- II. Overview of process (Wendy)
 - a. How does it work –testing and EL and Harvard documentation
 - b. Problems could be data, table or functional
 - c. Aleph followed MARC standard --what a surprise
 - d. Doing the easy stuff first and holding off on the more challenging records—one dedicated staff person
- III. Local data problems and historical decisions (Wendy)
 - a. Holdings
 - i. 866/867/868^0 \$8 0 \$a
 - ii. Some holdings have many lines
 - iii. Hadn't fully implemented ANSI/NISO z39.71-1999
 - iv. Had been waiting since contract obligation was signed in Aleph contract
 - v. Some holdings are split in locations in the same runs
 - b. Captions
 - i. Captions moved to holdings wih v.17
 - ii. Only one caption per title
 - iii. Captions made to work with workarounds (needed cleanup)
 - iv. Items not linked to a caption
 - c. Data was fudged to ensure sorting as desired
 - d. Enum / chron conversion Iowa retained NOTIS sort order by converting as a ten digit number
 - i. Bad for recall
 - ii. Bad for dual linkage
 - iii. Didn't work for multiple copies volumes didn't line up correctly
- IV. Global Changes (Sue)

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- a. Remove 00000 copy numbers from LAW records NOTE: Iowa global changes are done by a local perl scripting
- b. Linking item and HOL records
- c. Fix enum / chron where date was first level of enum
- d. Fix funky enum_a for items onverted from NOTIS—Iowa local problem
 - i. Parsing the description field to get information for the appropriate data in the enum / chron fields
- e. See handout for the commands to do the global changes
- f. If there were multiple pair combinations, manual cleanup was needed and a report was generated for review
- V. Tables setup (see handout for details)
 - a. First tells the system to update the language code in HOL to match what is in BIB (xxx/tab/tab_fix)
 - b. Creates summary holdings field: xxx60/pc-ta
